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
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HUDMO Volunteers Help Raise \$\$ for WMHT

Phil Caruso Lensman of the Stars



"We are beginning a series of articles about our members and interesting aspects of their lives. We hope that if you have something interesting to share you will contact us and allow other members to hear your story."

For this edition I thought it might be interesting to talk to Phillip Caruso. I spoke to him just two days after the Academy Awards. You will see why this is important after I introduce him to you. Phil was born in New Orleans and attended Loyola University of New Orleans. He, his wife Katherine, fourteen year old son Vincent, and sixteen year old daughter Sarah enjoy upstate New York from their home in Averill Park. Beginning with his father there has been a long history of loyalty to the Mercedes-Benz brand. Phil currently drives an S420. He has previously owned an E320 wagon and a 1979 450SL. His favorite was the 450SL. He does however still own a 1979 MG Midget, go figure.

He joined the Mercedes-Benz Club of America in 1979. Over the years Phil's career has taken him away from home for as long as six months at a time but at least for now he is traveling less and spending valuable time with his family.

Now back to the previously mentioned Academy Awards, Phil is a professional photographer working exclusively in the motion picture industry. As a youngster he worked with his father who was a cameraman, writer, producer of documentaries and feature films in the nineteen fifties and sixties. His experience and career grew and he began working with Ron Howard. After three years with Howard he was asked to become an on-call photographer for Robert De Niro, Tribeca and Canal Productions. That experience moved him from Los Angeles to New York and introduced him to Martin Scorsese, Capra Films, he then became their photographer. His unique working talent enabled him to work throughout the industry on more than 100 film projects with directors Ron Howard, Martin Scorsese, Francis Ford Coppola, Barry Levinson, Robert Zemeckis, Terry Giliam, John Waters and many more. His work has been featured in several one man shows in some of the most prestigious photo galleries in the country. His list of Photography Awards is very impressive.

While watching the Oscars with his family he saw many of the actors and directors that he had come to know over the years. It was much to his surprise and delight that Meryl Streep was named best actress for her role as Margret Thatcher in the movie "The Iron Lady". Wow, he has worked with Meryl Streep. What a lucky guy. So how many other famous actors and directors does he know? The list would be too long for the limited space we have. This month (March 2012) HBO aired a film called "Game Change" starring Ed Harris as John McCain in which Phil did the still photography. You will often see Phil and son Vincent at our Tech Sessions and our annual Section show as well as other events. From what I have observed Vincent has begun to appreciate the Mercedes brand as much as Phil does. As you would suspect Phil has used his Mercedes in the background of several films and was once asked to have an actor drive one of his cars in a film to which he agreed until they told him they would have to paint it black, apparently he does not like black cars. We would like to thank Phil for sharing his work experience with us and wish him well with future projects.



George is certified as an automotive instructor, Drivers Education instructor, NCCER (National Certification for Career Education and Research) instructor (in both core building construction and green buildings). He has taught at Northeast Parent and Child, Hudson Valley Community College, and Capitol Region BOCES.

In the fall of 2011 he received the Vic Mion Distinguished Service Award for sustained contributions from Habitat for Humanity of Schenectady County, Inc.. George conducts a bi-monthly volunteer day with students from Job Corps in conjunction with habitat, equinox of Albany, NY, and other non-profit organizations.

George and his wife Lynn will celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary on June 13th of this year. They have three children, Timothy, twenty-two, Steven twenty and Sarah sixteen.

George owns a black 1988 Mercedes 300 SEL, a dark blue 1987 300SD, and a white 1992 190E. "My hobbies include automotive restoration, green home energy star rated repairs, and long walks with Lynn. My sons and I love to restore and repair vehicles." George said.





Car Tips

A new feature we are trying for the newsletter is: "what do you need to do to keep your Benz in tip top shape and make it more fun to drive and admire?"

With that in mind, I will pose the first question.

How do you remove pine tar from your vehicle without damaging the paint?

RICK WALKER

Good afternoon, my detail department uses denatured alcohol to remove pine sap. A plastic razor blade can be used to remove the majority and the alcohol for the rest.

Also remember to apply a good coat of high quality wax in the spring and fall, at least, to help prevent penetration into the paint.

This sounds like a good column for the newsletter. I'm sure questions like how to maintain tire life, what to do about ever increasing alcohol content in the fuel of limited use vehicles, what oil to use in older non-roller cam engines, how often to service "life-time fill" transmissions, etc. should be interesting reading for most.

RON TANNER

I use Turtle Wax Bug and Tar Remover, spray on, wait about a minute and using a microfiber cloth wipe gently. Be sure surface is cool to the touch.

STANLEY ROSENBERG

Carefully! If it is one spot, use a soft cloth soaked in mineral spirits and rub gently. Clay may work if it is very light and over a large area. I demonstrated the use of clay a few years ago at one of our shows in Queensbury. Do a test spot first. Let me know the results. Make sure to apply a good quality wax to the area after all contaminants are removed.

I will not wait until the quarterly newsletter to answer your questions. I will email you as soon as I receive the answers. I am assembling a panel of experts to help you. I will publish the most interesting questions and answers. If you did not see your questions or answers, fear not, I will email a supplement to the "Brain Trust" and "Car Tips"

TIM VAN DER WOUDE

A great way to remove pine tree sap without hurting your car's finish, is to use a soft terry cloth and some rubbing alcohol. Apply just a touch of alcohol to the towel, then wipe the area in a circular motion until all the sap is removed. It may take more than one application to remove the spot entirely. After sap is removed, use a microfiber towel and some quick detailer or quick wax to resine the area to pre-sap condition!

Note: If you prefer to use the alcohol with microfiber towels, that's an idea too. Although, personal experience has shown me that they don't remove as much pine sap as terry towels, and therefore require more passes/applications to remove. Sometimes, you may end up leaving a ring of sap behind due to the softness of the microfiber composition. (T-shirts are not recommended because they can leave tiny scratches in the vehicle's clearcoat.)

It would be advisable to remove pine sap immediately or at least as soon as possible. Rubbing alcohol is the best product to use. Please use a soft cloth and rub gently. Let the product do the work for you.

Rubbing alcohol will not harm factory applied paint but it has been known to damage motorcars that have been repainted with lower quality or un-hardened paints. It is advisable to do a test area that is rarely seen first to prevent the possibility of causing damage to the exterior paint.

We should also be aware that if pine sap is allowed to dry out (even on factory applied Mercedes Paint) it will cause permanent stains down to the metal.

If there is interest, I would happily conduct an open house to help educate club members about the best practices of exterior paint care.
